Amendments to CASLPO's Registration

Requirements

On March 12, 2021, amendments to CASLPO's Registration Regulation were **approved** by the Ontario government.

There are 8 important changes that may affect you including a new exam requirement for new applicants, "non-practicing" title requirements, and suspension provisions.
